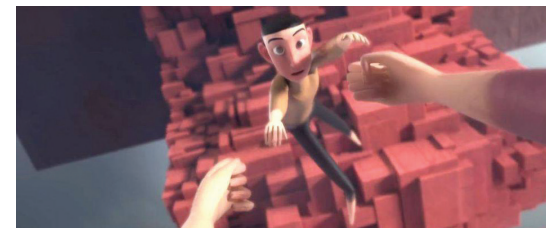

HEATHER BOOTH: CHANGING THE WORLD
USA | 61 MINUTES



"Heather Booth is the most influential person you've never heard of," says filmmaker Lilly Rivlin. Chronicling the life of Heather Booth, a lifelong progressive organizer, the film follows her journey from civil rights activist in the '60s to her founding of the Midwest Academy, a training institute for progressive community organizers. As a teenager, she spent time in Israel, where a visit to Yad Vashem moved her to make a commitment to fight against injustice. For more than 40 years, she has been a major force in the movement for women's rights and economic justice. The film features interviews with Senator Elizabeth Warren and other organizers, as well as current Midwest Academy students, who explore Booth's legacy.

HEATHER BOOTH (BIO ABOVE)



DARRAH DIGIORGIO JOHNSON

President and CEO of Planned Parenthood of the Pacific Southwest since 2006. She leads one of the largest Planned Parenthood affiliates with 17 health centers providing health care to more than 137,000 people in San Diego, Riverside, and Imperial counties. Darrah has dedicated her career to ensuring

broad public access to reproductive health care through direct service, education, and advocacy.



CHRISTINE PELOSI

Attorney, author, and advocate, partner at the IMPACT firm, Chair of the California Democratic Party Women's Caucus, and a Democratic National Committeewoman. She has served as a local prosecutor, Clinton-Gore administration special counsel, and Capitol Hill chief of staff. A volunteer in campaigns since the stroller, she

has campaigned proudly for her mother, U.S. House Democratic Leader Nancy Pelosi, and has conducted 12 years of leadership training based on her two Campaign Boot Camp books. She is the 2015 recipient of the Heather Booth Award.
