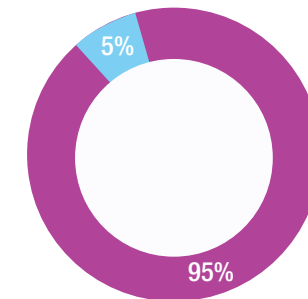

BREAST HEALTH PROGRAMS

In honor of National Breast Cancer Awareness Month, here's why we need your support! Planned Parenthood is a critical resource for women in the fight to detect breast cancer early. Nearly 90% of patients at Planned Parenthood's local centers in Rancho Mirage and Coachella are under age 40, and for these women, clinical breast exams are key to early detection. In total, our health centers in Rancho Mirage and Coachella perform more than **1,800** breast cancer screenings each year. Over the past few years, we have significantly expanded breast health education, outreach, and services to help detect breast cancer at its onset. Your support ensures Planned Parenthood continues to develop and expand health care services while addressing barriers to getting care.

As the Coachella Valley's leading women's health care provider and advocate, Planned Parenthood provides essential health care services, including routine gynecological exams, breast and cervical cancer screenings, contraceptive services, sexually transmitted infection testing and treatment, and HIV testing and education to nearly **15,000** women, men, and adolescents in the region. **One in five women in the U.S. has visited a Planned Parenthood health center at least once in her life.**

**LETTER TO ANITA**

Award-winning filmmaker Andrea Meyerson explores the painful legacy of singer Anita Bryant's infamous anti-gay campaign of the late 1970s. Narrated by Emmy-nominated actress Meredith Baxter, the film tells the story of Ronni Sanlo, a married mother of two who came out as a lesbian and divorced her husband, losing custody of her children as a result—an injustice that propelled Ronni into a life of LGBT activism.

Dr. Ronni Sanlo is a well-known keynote speaker and workshop presenter. Her focus is LGBT history, learning outcomes, strategic planning, and LGBT center development. Ronni speaks not only from her perspective as a higher education/student affairs

professor, LGBT center director, dean of students, and faculty in residence, but also from her personal life experiences. In 2013 Ronni was honored with being included in the National Women's Hall of Fame (Seneca Falls, NY).
